Climate Emergency Declaration

Hythe Town Council declared a Climate and Ecological Emergency in mid-2019.

This set a zero-carbon date for the council of 2025 at the latest.

HTC has set about measuring and monitoring the council's carbon footprint and has committed to report annually on progress.
